<b>Profile of Area</b>	Fielding Ward is a 22 bedded Rehabilitation/Sub-Acute Ward in Ashford Hospital. The ward functions through a Multi-Professional Disciplinary Team including a Consultant, Specialist Registers, Nursing Team, Social Services, Physio and Occupational Therapy Team. The ward also has close working relationship with community teams such as Virgin Care. The majority of patients are admitted via A&E or transferred from St Peters for rehabilitation. Ashford Hospital has no A&E, there is a walk in centre, clinics, day surgery and four inpatient wards.

### Trust Information

Ashford and St. Peter's Hospitals NHS Trust manages two sites - Ashford Hospital in Middlesex and St. Peter's Hospital in Chertsey, Surrey.

The Trust as a whole provides acute hospital services to a large and diverse population, with a catchment of around 450,000 stretching from West Hounslow to Woking across the Boroughs of Hounslow, Spelthorne, Elmbridge, Runnymede and Woking

### Philosophy of Care (Medical)

### **Aims of Service**

The service aims to give patients the right care at the right time. It aims to be safe and provide excellent care through maintain our Trust's core values, putting patients first, personal responsibility, passion for excellence and pride in our team.

### **Team members**

Students will work with and alongside all the members of the nursing team, including Ward Manager, Deputy Sister / Charge Nurse, Senior Staff Nurse, Staff Nurse, Health Care Assistant, Medical Support Worker, and the Ward Clerk.

There are a variety of other healthcare professionals who care for patients on Fielding Ward. These include the Consultants and their medical team, Discharge coordinators, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Pharmacists, and Dieticians.

### **Staff Development**

#### **Link Nurses**

Fielding Ward supports the Link Nurse; the role is to ensure that all members of the team are aware of current practice and policies within their designated role. The link attends regular meetings to update their knowledge and also influence future practice through contributing to Trust policy development. ### **Professional Development**

Nursing staff on Fielding Ward are able to undertake continuing professional development in care areas such as Mentoring, Palliative Care, Leadership with some modules being completed at the University of Surrey.

### **Daily Routine**

**Handover** - The start of a shift begins with 'handover' or 'report' of patient information, this promotes continuity of care and allows staff to review and plan care. All patients are discussed with the nurse in charge and therapists.

#### **Multi Disciplinary Team (MDT) meetings**

#### **Protected Meal times**

Fielding Ward has protected meal times at lunch and supper; this time allows the nursing staff to facilitate serving of the meal and to monitor the food consumed.

#### **Referral Criteria/ Admission methods**

Patients are admitted to Fielding Ward via a number of different routes: from A&E, a booked admission, after attending an outpatient's clinic, discharge from Medical High Dependency Unit or transferred from another hospital.
