Professional Development

Nursing staff on Kingfisher are able to undertake continuing professional development in care areas stoma care, pain control, nutrition, diabetes

Daily Routine

Handover - The start of a shift begins with 'handover' or 'report' of patient information, this promotes continuity of care and allows staff to review and plan care. All patients are discussed with the nurse in charge and therapists.

Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) meetings

Protected Meal times

Kingfisher has protected meal times at lunch and supper; this time allows the nursing staff to facilitate serving of the meal and to monitor the food consumed.

Referral Criteria/ Admission methods

Patients are admitted to via a number of different routes: from A&E, a booked admission, after attending an outpatient's clinic, discharge from Medical High Dependency Unit or transferred from another hospital.
