





















COVID-19 - Road Map for ASPH Visiting

<p>Government Roadmap</p>	<p>From 17 May onwards</p> 	<p>Joan Booker Ward (Maternity postnatal)</p>	<p>1 chosen birthing partner from the same household/bubble</p> 
<p>Adult Visiting</p>	<p>Visiting restriction in place</p> <p>Visiting permitted for up to 1 hour 3 times a week. The booking of visits will be co-ordinated via the volunteers in PALS. All visitors must have a documented risk assessment and wear mask and PPE when visiting</p> <p>60 Mins</p>  <p>3 x week</p> 	<p>Maternity Antenatal OPD</p>	<p>1 chosen birthing partner from the same household/bubble</p> 
<p>Carer</p>	<p>Daily visit for up to 1 hour for carers supporting patients with learning disabilities, dementia or providing interpreting. Carers will be permitted to be with patients during an ED attendance also</p> <p>60 Mins</p>  	<p>Emergency Department</p>	<p>Adult ED. All EOL & carers: 1 person can accompany patient For Paeds ED: 1 parent can accompany increasing to 2 parents from 21 June (due to size of ED)</p> 
<p>End of Life (EOL)</p>	<p>Daily visit as agreed by palliative care team - Up to a maximum of 2 visitors per visit wearing PPE</p> <p>60 Mins</p>  	<p>Adult Outpatients</p>	<p>1 person can accompany from the same household/bubble if the patient requires mobility support or support with receiving bad news</p> 
<p>Trust business visitors/reps</p>	<p>No visiting from 17 May From 21 June to be appointment only with risk assessment being completed and PPE being worn</p>  	<p>Pre-assessment Unit OPD 15</p>	<p>1 person can accompany patient to drop off and pick up from unit, unless a carer/interpreter</p> 
<p>Paediatric Wards</p>	<p>* Due to the nature of the care given and space constraints on our Paediatric Wards, visiting restrictions are;</p> <p>Ash Ward – 2 parents/carers from the same household/bubble in tag team. Oak Ward – 1 parent/carer. Outpatients – 1 parent/carer</p> 	<p>Endoscopy</p>	<p>1</p> 
<p>Maternity labour</p>	<p>1 chosen birthing partner from the same household/bubble</p> 	<p>Ashford In-patient wards</p>	<p>Visitors are only permitted on Wordsworth and Chaucer wards for up to 1 hour, 3 times a week. To book an slot, please contact the wards directly. 1 person can accompany a patient to drop off and pick up from wards, unless a carer/interpreter and EOL. This is to keep Ashford as 'green' as possible.</p>
